Where it all started





WHERE: Alicante, Spain (in the Valencian Region)

WHO: FEPEVAL (the regional federation of industrial parks) and funded by the Diputación de Alicante (province)

WHAT: to develop a pioneering industrial-urban symbiosis (IUS) programme.

Our mission:

- 1. Uncover and activate the potential of industrial symbiosis in business areas
- 2. Strengthen territorial competitiveness through a network of EGM facilitators
- 3. Design a new, more efficient and resilient territorial production model by 2050

This work is embedded in the Reindustrialization Strategy and 2050 Competitivity Plan of the Valencian Region.

The instrument



FACILITATION = connector between territorial actors

HOW: ISL Workshop methodology (NISP®) + Resource matching platform (SYNERGIE®)

WHY: 20 years of tested methodology used in over 30 countries.

IMPLEMENTATION:

- RedecoEC facilitators trained by ISL
- EGMs and other local business associations

Strategic Enablers

- Cities and regions set the long-term vision (e.g., climate neutrality 2050, competitivity and reindustrialization tool) and align IUS with economic development and industrial policy. They link micro-level resource flows with macro-level policy, investment, and infrastructure.
- Their backing ensures continuity, funding, and integration with territorial planning.

Governance Builders

- EGMs and local associations (created or supported by public institutions) act as on-the-ground multipliers (mobilize participation, facilitate workshops, maintain engagement, translate regional to local actions).
- Local authorities play a key role in scaling up by empowering these entities.

Awareness Catalysts

- Regional support helps normalize collaboration between competitors, industries, and unexpected actors (e.g. hospitals, NGOs).
- IUS becomes a visible tool to tackle shared problems like waste, space, labor, and emissions.
